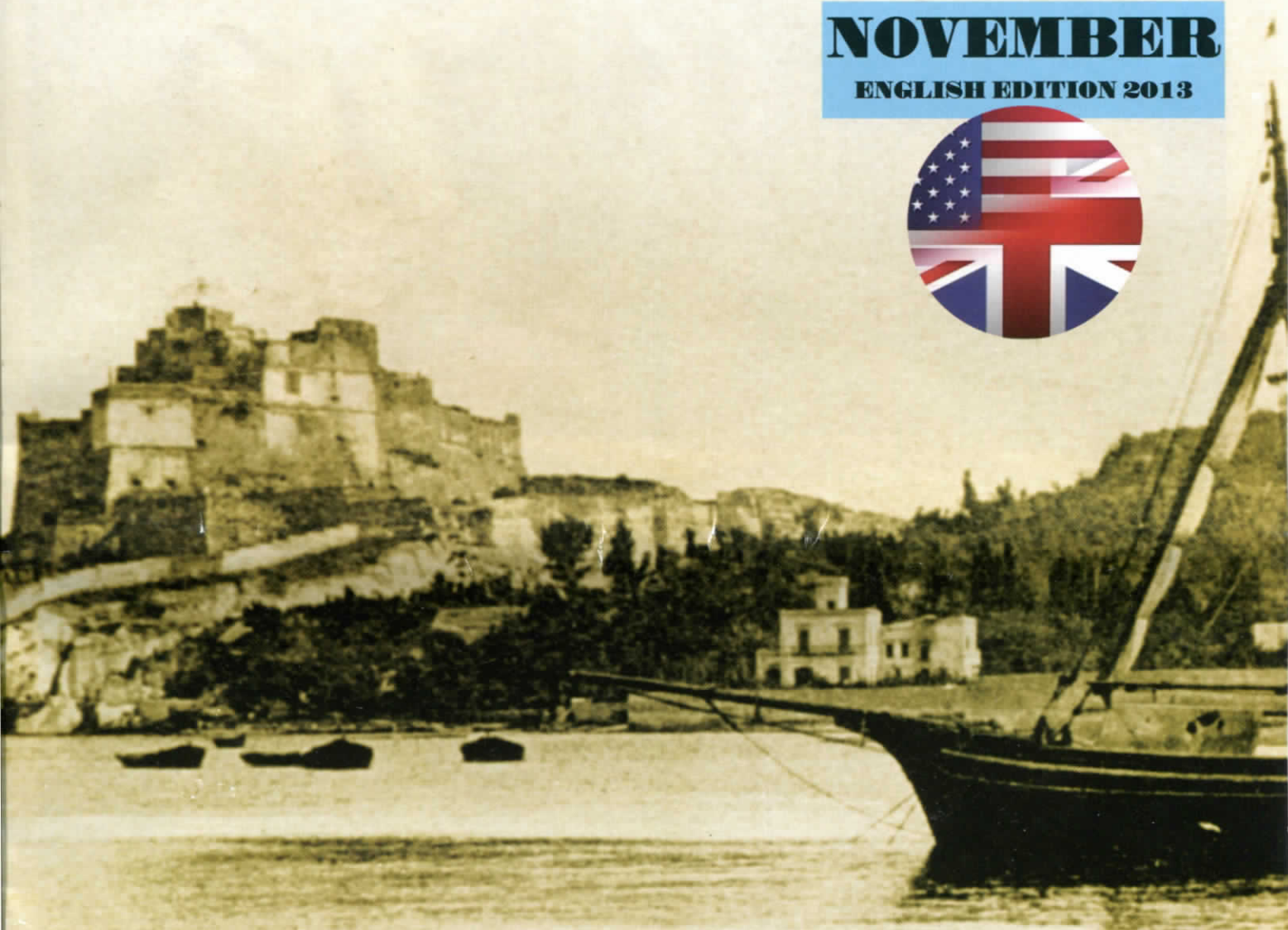

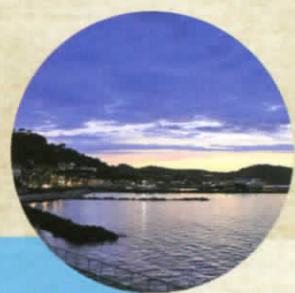

“Animals don’t have nationalities”

Then along came an Englishman...



Hawksley was in his early 20's as he set off on his tour of Italy. Thinking of “animal welfare” in Italy, one name may spring to mind: *Giuseppe Garibaldi*, from Turin with a brave start in 1871 attempting to prevent animal cruelty but unable to bond a nationwide movement. *Leonard Hawksley* could never be the household name that *Garibaldi* was, but his remarkable achievements in Italy would put him on equal if not stronger footing in the realm of animal protection. Hawksley's first focus was on the horrendous sights he witnessed in Naples regarding horses and mules. He founded the *Naples Society for the Protection of Animals* and then succeeded in setting up a group in Rome with 40 inspectors to investigate cases throughout the country. Often paying dearly the consequences for his crusade, to critics who asked why a foreigner was meddling in animal welfare of a country not his own, he would reply: **“Animals don’t have nationalities”**.

After taking on a “battle of the birds” in Capri, *Hawksley* took the Camorra head on. In 1912, cruel sports became punishable by law. During world war one, he played a key role in forming the *Italian Blue Cross* with 22 veterinary hospitals saving the lives of some 35,000 mules and horses. *Hawksley* returned to England sadly in ill health in 1931 leaving behind 22 animal protection societies in Italy either founded personally or thanks to his assistance. The spirit of his work lives on through the **AISPA**.

AISPA - Anglo-Italian Society for the Protection of Animals

- is a British based charity raising funds worldwide for animal welfare organisations throughout Italy. With thirty projects involving voluntary representatives they help to support the purchase of much needed medicines, surgical equipment, rescue vehicles, education and training. **AISPA** fully funds a mobile spay clinic for stray sterilization throughout Italy. All supported sanctuaries are fully active spay and neuter centres, carrying out TRAP-NEUTER-RELEASE initiatives throughout Italy, even though there are still today numerous un-treated feral cat and dog colonies which “survive” thanks only to volunteer help.
